Criteria used for the Citizenship Award:

- Minimum GPA of 3.25
- Application, including current high school transcript and essay answer

To apply for the Citizenship Award please make a hard copy of the application paper, high school transcript, and essay, and turn them into the office of Northpoint Homeschool Academy by Feb. 1st, 2024.

**The award committee can decide to award one, two, or no Citizenship Award in a given year. Decisions will be based on the strength of the applicants.*
